



BRUCE MASON'S GUIDE TO CROSS-COUNTRY SKI EQUIPMENT

Only a limited number of retailers in Dunedin and Christchurch are stocking any gear this year. My enquiries were made during the first week of July, 1987. The items listed are suitable for general touring on the Central Otago Ranges, rather than specifically for telemarking or ski-mountaineering.

SKIS must have metal edges. Can have either patterned bases or be smooth for waxes. 'Multigrade' soles don't work well in Otago conditions. Length - reaching to wrist of upright arm for average body weight. If in doubt get shorter skis.

BOOTS wear 2 pairs of socks. Make sure you have plenty of toe room, no heel-slip, and no pressure-points.

POLES Length - to armpit.

There doesn't appear to be much / nothing available in Dunedin or Christchurch shops. However, the following Australian shops should be able to supply;





NEWS FROM THE PREVIOUS COMMITTEE MEETING

A few items that might interest you;

(1) on acceptance as a member of the OTMC, a person can claim a refund of any non-member surcharges paid for the 2 qualifying trips that are needed to become a member.

(2) trip refunds will now be paid out automatically (when the refund is greater than \$5.00), instead of trip-members having to fill out claim forms as at present.

Both these changes arose following suggestions made at the Special General Meeting. So you see, we do act on feedback that we get from input from outside the committee - all we

need is people to care about how this club is operating, and let the present committee know their feelings.

(3) instruction courses run within the OTMC will be on a voluntary basis (ie. on the part of the instructors). Where insufficient voluntary instructors are available from within the ranks of the club, outside instruction may be arranged, and in this case instruction fees may be levied.

So far the committee has recieved only 1 letter regarding the policy matter that the Special General Meeting was called for. We still need to know how club-members feel about the suggestions that:

- (1) we stop putting money into the club investment funds (ie. Clubrooms and Hut-Building Funds....see last bulletin for details).
- (2) interest from these investment funds be re-invested so as to maintain the real value in dollar terms of these funds.
- (3) all club income (ie. subscriptions, etc.) be used to cover the day-to-day running costs of the club.
- (4) subscriptions for the current year be set at the AGM in August of that year, on presentation of the accounts from the previous year.
- (5) the present discount for early payment of subscriptions be changed to a surcharge for late payment.

If you have any thoughts about how the club should set subscriptions and allocate club income, why not make a comment to any person on the committee now, rather than wait for the AGM? Speak to a committee member on club nights....write to the club secretary....come to the next committee meeting....write to the editor of this bulletin....there are lots of avenues to persue, really.



Our own Mike Floate, showing us some slides on his pet hobby, the Gold-Mining areas of Otago.


